



# PASSENGER PLANE CARRYING 10 PEOPLE INCLUDING THREE CHILDREN IS MISSING OVER INDONESIA

**Small aircraft was travelling between Masamba and Makassar on Friday**

**Officials confirmed contact had been lost with the DHC-6 Twin Otter plane**

**Plane was carrying three crew and seven passengers for one-hour flight**

A passenger plane carrying 10 people including three children has gone missing in Indonesia.

The country's Aviastar airline said contact had been lost with the Twin Otter aircraft travelling between Masamba and Makassar, in the South Sulawesi province, on Friday afternoon.

The plane lost radio contact around 11 minutes after taking off in good weather at 14.25pm, Transportation Ministry spokesman Julius Barata said.

It was carrying three crew and seven passengers, and no distress signal was received, Mr Barata added.

A rescue team has been sent to search for the plane, which was due to land at 15.39pm.

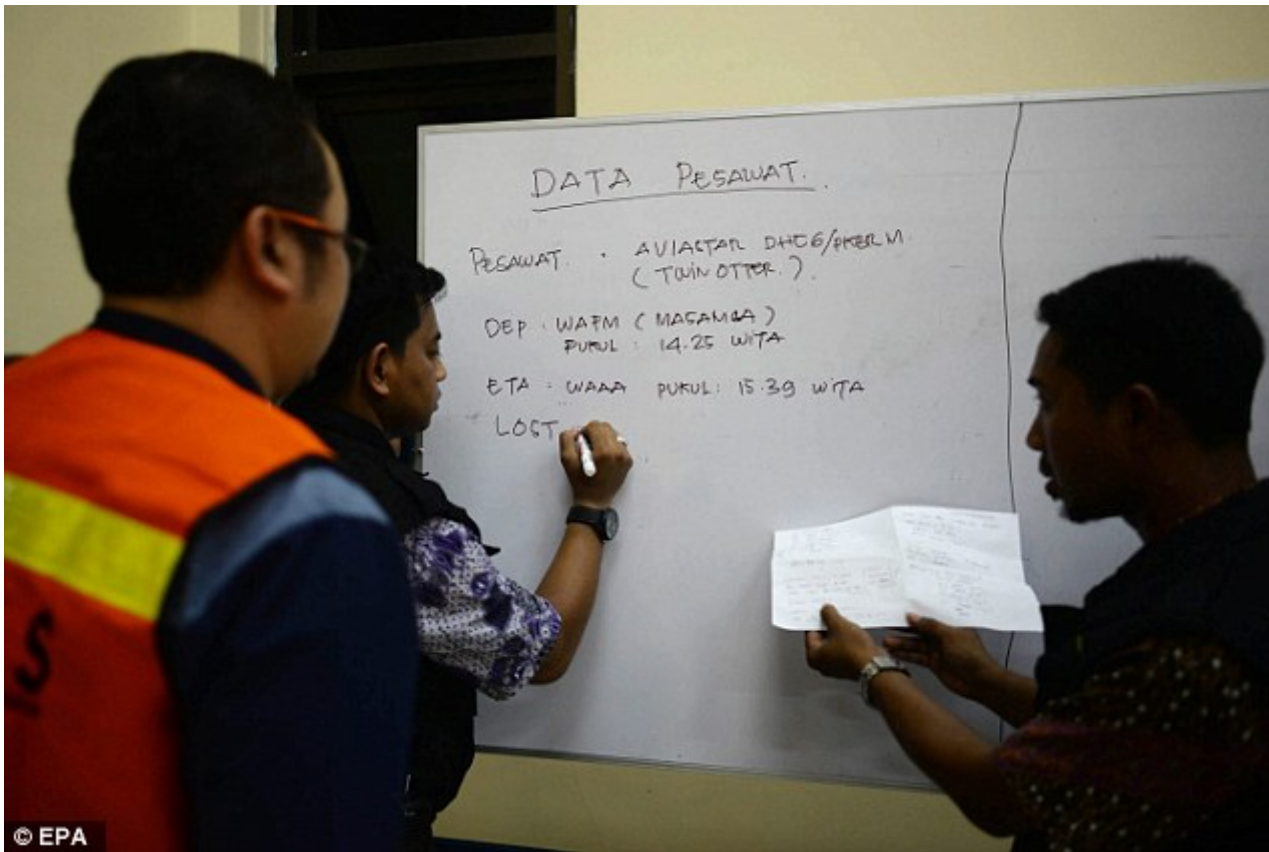
Ahmad Munir, head of the airport authority in Makassar, said satellite data showed the aircraft's

last known position was about 20 miles from Masamba.

Indonesia has been plagued by transportation accidents in recent years, including plane and train crashes and ferry sinkings.

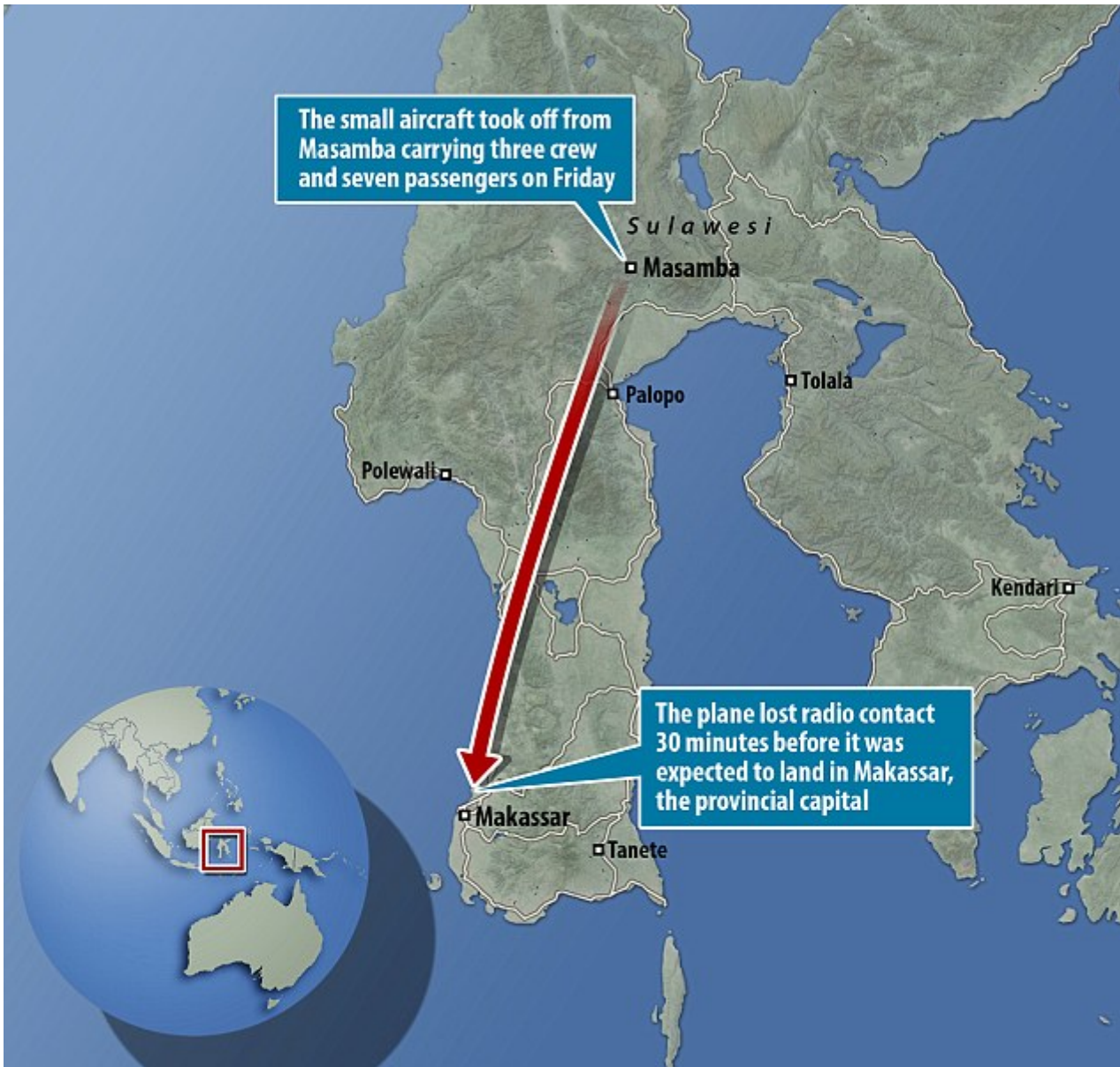


Agus Susanto, Hasanuddin International Airport Chief Officer, talks to the media during a press conference over the missing Aviastar plane

It is one of Asia's most rapidly expanding airline markets, but is struggling to obtain qualified pilots, mechanics, air traffic controllers and updated airport technology.

The crash comes 18 months after Malaysia Airlines plane MH370 went missing on a flight from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing with 239 people on board.

A wing from the aircraft was discovered on a remote Indian Ocean late this summer but the fate of the doomed jet has never been confirmed.

Malaysia Airlines was hit by another disaster in July last year when a Boeing-777 carrying 283 passengers and 15 crew was shot down near the Ukraine-Russia border.
