



RYANAIR ANNOUNCES \$200M INVESTMENT IN LONDON LUTON WITH 2 NEW BASED AIRCRAFT

Ryanair, Europe's No.1 airline announced an investment of \$200 million at London Luton airport with 2 new based aircraft (6 aircraft in total) for its winter 2018 schedule and added 6 new routes to Alicante, Athens, Barcelona, Bologna, Cork and Malaga and more flights on its existing Vilnius route. Ryanair's winter 2018 London Luton schedule will now deliver a total of 21 routes which will help deliver 2.2m customers p.a.
