



AVINCIS TAKES DELIVERY OF TWO FIVE-BLADED H145S DESTINED FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES OPERATIONS IN ITALY AND SWEDEN

Avincis took delivery of two five-bladed H145 aircraft at the Airbus facility in Donauwörth, Germany. Both aircraft will be deployed in Avincis Helicopter Emergency Medical Services operations. One will join the fleet in Italy, strengthening operations across Avincis' network of Italian bases. The other will join the Avincis fleet in Stockholm, Sweden, supporting our customers' growing needs in the region. Two further five-bladed H145 will be delivered to support our Swedish EMS partners in early 2025.

John Boag, Group CEO, Avincis, commented: "The delivery of these aircraft supports our confidence in the potential of the global emergency aviation services market and fulfils the requirements of our near- and long-term fleet strategy. The five-bladed H145 is a versatile and reliable aircraft, which has proven capability in the field, aligning to Avincis' commitment to operational and safety excellence. Our established, trusting relationships with Airbus and LCI demonstrate our continued commitment to expanding as a world-class group in emergency aviation services."

We are proud that the H145 will again provide support to people when they need it most.”
