



HAWTHORNE BREAKS GROUND ON HANGAR AT CHICAGO EXECUTIVE AIRPORT

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Chicago Executive Airport announced groundbreaking of Hawthorne Global Aviation Services' 36,900-square facility to include Class A hangar and office space. Construction of the Hangar 22 project is expected to be completed by the end of the year. The new facility is in compliance with the airport's Master Plan which has been approved by the Village of Wheeling and the City of Prospect Heights.

CEA Chairman D. Court Harris, commented: "We welcome Hawthorne's significant investment at the airport and are excited about their expansion, especially the important addition of hangar space. These improvements will enhance the airport's value as an important economic engine for our community."
