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Dassault Aviation elite team of service specialists, equipment and rapid response aircraft will be positioned at airports near Davos the week of January 20th. To serve Falcon crews attending the Davos event, Dassault Aviation has reinforced its support teams at Zurich International Airport and St. Gallen–Altenrhein Airport, making available resources from its newly acquired service centers in Switzerland (TAG Maintenance Services and the business aviation operations of RUAG) and from elsewhere in the Falcon Support organization.

Falcon Response is the only AOG service equipped with dedicated aircraft, two Falcon 900Bs, which help speed transport of spare parts, tools and technicians to remote sites and provide alternative lift, when needed, to get passengers to their final destination.

In addition, Falcon operators will have immediate access to routine troubleshooting services provided by the 24/7 global Falcon Command Center.
