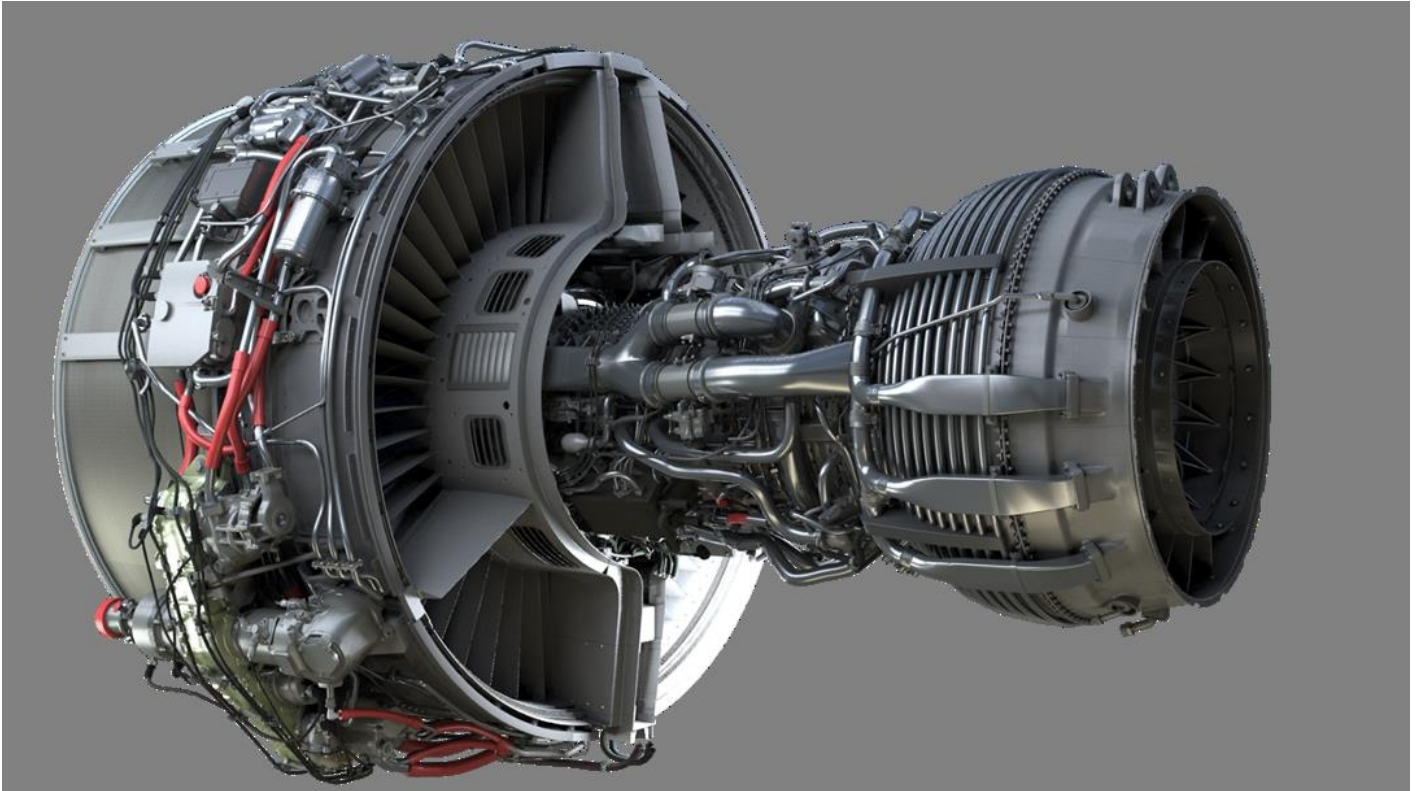




STORM AVIATION INTRODUCES AIRBUS A320NEO LEAP-1A DIFFERENCES TRAINING

Throughout the training period which will last until the end of April, 2018, the company plans to prepare circa 200 Airbus A320neo Leap-1A engine professionals.
