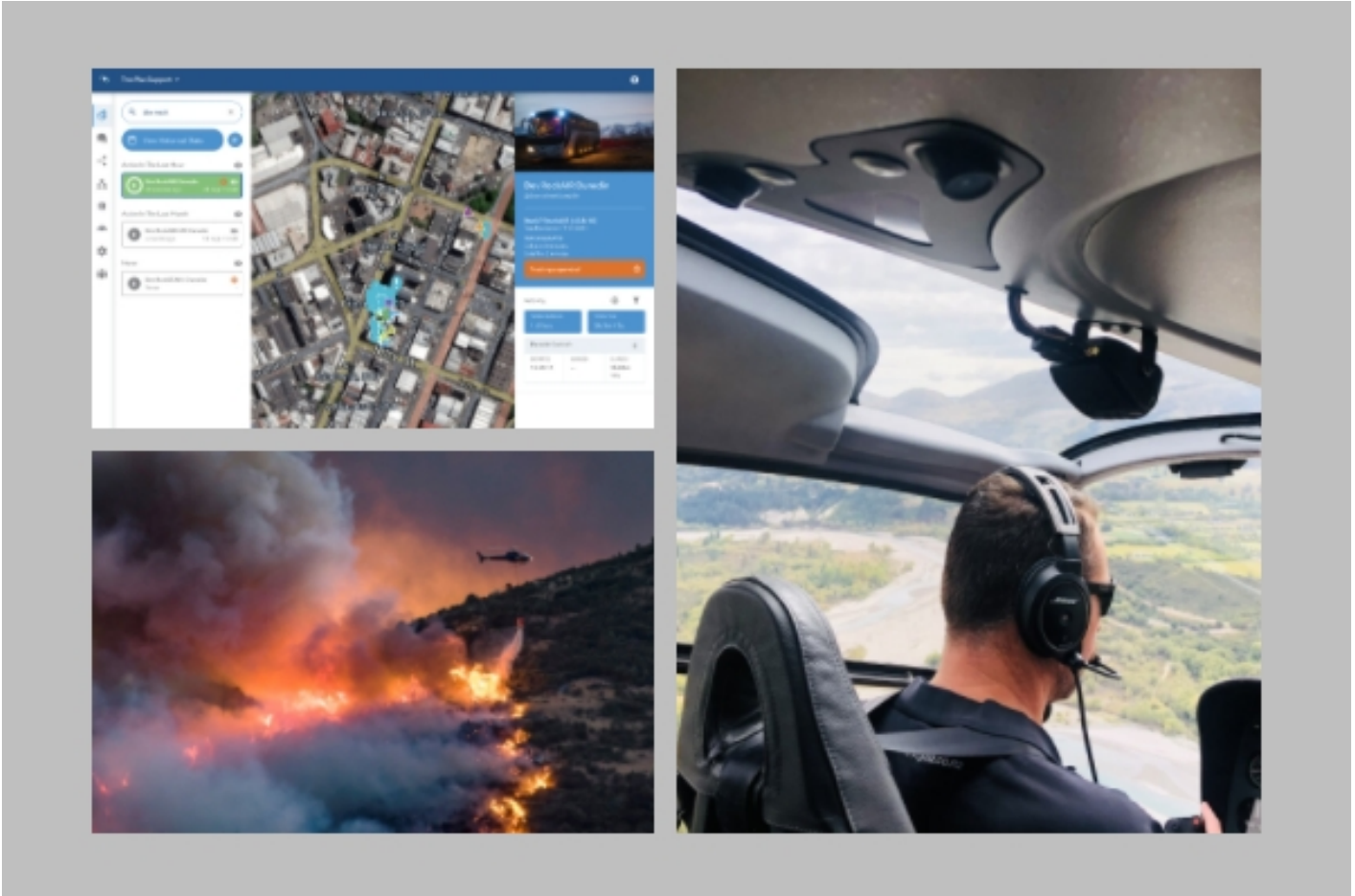




FOUR LEADING NEW ZEALAND AEROSPACE COMPANIES TAKE THE STAGE AT HAC 2023
