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Queensland-based Horizon Airways has signed an order for a second Tecnam P2012 STOL aircraft. Slated to join the Australian fleet by the end of 2026, this subsequent order rapidly builds upon the historic introduction of the country's first P2012 STOL, signaling a massive leap forward for regional air travel. Operating since 1994, Horizon Airways is a vital lifeline for communities across Central, Western, and Northern Queensland. The decision to double down on the P2012 STOL platform emphasizes the airline's commitment to replacing an aging fleet of 1970s-era aircraft with state-of-the-art aviation technology.

Ed Morrison, CEO of Horizon Airways commented: "The anticipation surrounding our initial P2012 STOL order has been incredible, and adding a second aircraft to our future fleet was a natural step. This aircraft represents the exact future we envision for regional air travel across the Torres

Strait and Cape communities. This acquisition by Horizon Airways marks a significant milestone for Tecnam in the region, bringing the total number of P2012 aircraft operating in Australia to five (5). The rapidly growing footprint of the P2012 series highlights the platform's versatility, reliability, and perfect suitability for the vast and demanding conditions of the Australian continent.
