



# EASYJET LAUNCHES NEW GLASGOW - MILAN MALPENSA ROUTE

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The new year round service, which is expected to carry 26,000 annually, is Glasgow's first direct connection to **Milan**. Flights operate twice weekly on Wednesday's and Saturday's with fares starting from £25.49 one way per person.

The airline already flies to Milan Malpensa from Edinburgh, London Gatwick and London Luton.
