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ALSIM has marked an important new step in its Australian growth with the installation of its Airliner simulator at Sydney Flight College (SFC). This deployment strengthens the company's role in delivering advanced, airline-focused pilot training and further reinforces its long-term commitment to elevating aviation training standards across the Oceania region.

The Airliner is an FNPT II MCC-certified hybrid simulator that combines fly-by-wire and conventional flight controls, offering the ideal platform for APS MCC and MPL Phase II advanced training. Purpose-built around APS MCC learning objectives, it develops key airline competencies such as automation management, crew coordination, leadership, and threat and error management. Its generic airliner design provides greater flexibility and broader skill transfer,

ensuring trainees are confidently prepared for airline pilot operations and able to transition smoothly into any type rating, regardless of aircraft type.

Joseph Pilo, CEO at SFC commented: “Today marks an important milestone for SFC Sydney Flight College, and for our academy here in Tamworth. The introduction of the Airliner simulator represents the final piece in delivering our complete airline pilot training pathway. Advanced simulation is now a critical part of preparing pilots for this environment. The Airliner allows our students to train in a realistic airline flight deck environment, developing the communication, teamwork and decision-making skills required in modern commercial aviation. Importantly, this investment also reinforces our commitment to regional New South Wales and to Tamworth as a growing centre for aviation training. At SFC, our focus is to prepare the next generation of professional pilots with the skills, mindset and operational experience required to succeed in modern airline operations. And this simulator is an important step in delivering that vision”.
