



EMBRAER AND JAPAN AIRLINES EXTEND POOL PROGRAM FOR E-JETS FLEET

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Embraer announced the extension of the Flight Hour Pool Program with Japan Airlines for J-AIR's growing fleet of E170s and E190s, which currently stand at 20 aircraft. The pool agreement, for up to ten years, covers more than 300 part numbers for J-AIR's entire E-Jets fleet. J-AIR currently operates 17 E170s and three E190s. The third E190 commenced revenue service at the start of September.
