A historic milestone for Australian aviation - Queensland-based Horizon Airways introduces country's first Tecnam P2012 STOL aircraft to its fleet. Operating since 1994, Horizon Airways has been a lifeline for communities across Central, Western, and Northern Queensland. The introduction of this purpose-built aircraft will revolutionize regional air travel in the Torres Strait and Cape communities, replacing an aging fleet of 1970s-era aircraft with state-of-the-art aviation technology.

The unique and pristine Torres Strait environment requires exceptional operational capabilities. The Tecnam P2012 STOL offers unprecedented short runway performance, giving Horizon Airways the ability to reliably service outer island communities—including Mabuiag, Darnley, and Murray Islands, which are home to some of Australia's shortest commercial airstrips. For the first

time, these Northern communities will benefit from the safety and peace of mind of modern, twin-engine operations. Passengers will also experience a dramatic upgrade in travel quality, with a spacious, air-conditioned cabin featuring nine ergonomic passenger seats.

Ed Morrison, CEO of Horizon Airways commented: “With the purchase of the Tecnam P2012 STOL, the future of regional air travel across the Torres Strait and Cape communities has begun. This first-of-its-kind aircraft in Australia has been purpose-built to meet the unique demands of our region and deliver a level of capability unlike anything currently operating in the market. Operating from Horn Island, the Tecnam P2012 STOL will allow us to provide safer, more reliable access throughout the Torres Strait and Northern Cape communities, while offering modern comfort for passengers travelling across some of Australia’s most remote locations. Its outstanding short runway performance gives us the ability to service outer island communities [...] while also providing nine air-conditioned passenger seats and the latest in modern aviation safety technology. We believe this aircraft represents a major step forward for regional aviation in Northern Australia and for the communities that rely on these essential services every day.”
